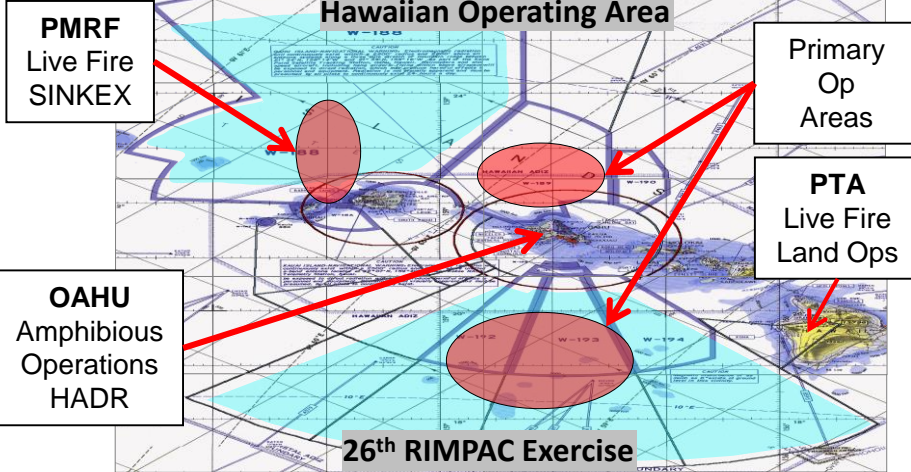

## Observer Program

- Dates: 16 - 20 July 2018
- First established during RIMPAC 2002
- Observer nations are invited and afforded a condensed overview of RIMPAC exercise activities during a week-long schedule of events, with the anticipation of future participation in RIMPAC.
- The Observer Program includes welcoming and overview briefings, an at-sea embarkation on an aircraft carrier and/or amphibious ship, helicopter or Carrier-on-Board Delivery (COD) flights, P3C indoctrination tour flight, as well as ashore activities.

# RIMPAC 2018 Overarching Scenario



## Themes

- **Economic disparity**
  - Orion discovered oil reserves and seeks Griffon's refinement capability via military action
- **Freedom of Navigation**
  - Orion harasses and eventually sinks merchant shipping in the Strait of Orion
  - Aggression against Griffon and RIMPAC nation
- **Counter piracy**
  - Purely criminal organization operating off the coast of Pandora and Yolo
- **Counterterrorism**
  - IED events in Griffon from ARM

## RIMPAC Players

- **Griffon (ally)**
  - Strongest economy in the region but limited military and defense capability
- **Orion (belligerent)**
  - Expansionist regime and the military "strong arm" in region
- **Pandora and Yolo (neutral)**
  - Provide physical separation in JOA to address JPN real-world constitutional restrictions
- **Disputant Resistance Armed Combatant Opposition (DRACO)**
  - Terrorist organization operating in Griffon and NW region of Yolo

# Humanitarian Assistance / Disaster Relief



## Concept

- Earthquake and tsunami scenario
  - Massive casualties, aftershocks, extensive infrastructure damage
- Japan-led HA / DR Task Force with Coalition Staff
- Live response emphasizing interactions with Host Nation, International Relief Community
- Collaborative HA / DR Harbor Phase Academics with Center for Excellence in Disaster Management, UN OCHA, US AID, IFRC, Navy War College

## Objectives

- Employ multinational force in a HA / DR scenario
- Plan and direct sustainment forces ashore in an HA / DR environment, both from the sea base and ashore.
- Emphasize realistic civil-military (CIV-MIL) interactions
- Cross-training and sharing of medical capabilities between military and civilian responders ashore and afloat
- The Joint Commission Accreditation of Healthcare Association of Hawaii (HAH) hospitals
- Annual Health and Human Service (HHS) Disaster Medical Assistance Team (DMAT) training requirements are met

# ***RIMPAC Experimentation***



- RIMPAC 2018 experimentation efforts will be executed with Navy Warfare Development Command as part of the Navy's Fleet Experimentation (FLEX) program
- The majority of experiments will take place as part of TRIDENT WARRIOR 2018
  - Co-sponsored by SPAWAR
  - TRIDENT WARRIOR is an annual large scale at-sea field experiment event that focuses on information warfare
- 39 experimental initiatives are scheduled to occur during RIMPAC 2018
- RIMPAC 2018 included an Innovation Fair for the first time

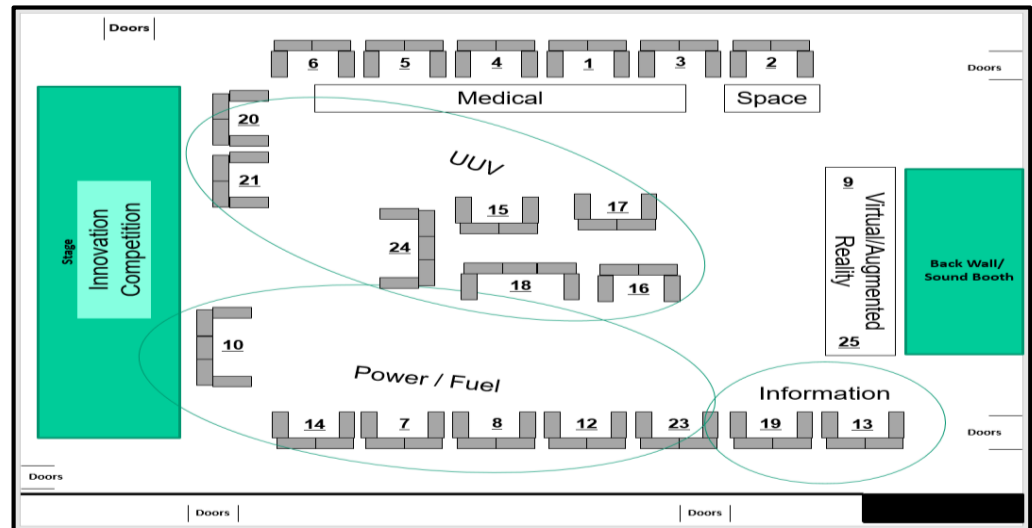
